Harry is scheduled to be in Leishan in Seichuan province located in south-central China. This is near the Provincial Capital city of Chengtu (for those of you who may have a map). His plans are to arrive August 5th and then leave on August 10th for home. He hopes to work from some yet to be determined local station in the area as AA2WN/BYcall, and presently Alan, BA1DU, is trying to locate a suitable nearby DX ham. This is a rather remote area of China, hence, to locate a station may not be that simple. Harry is not permitted by Chinese law to bring along any of his own equipment, rig, etc., hence, must rely on any locals or club stations. He hopes to be able to operate in-between his work skeds and will especially listen for the east coast. W1AW SEEKS 80-METER SIGNAL REPORTS

Maxim Memorial Station W1AW has changed its 80-meter bulletin antenna system and requests signal reports from those monitoring the 80-meter transmissions. An 80-meter "cage" dipole joined the W1AW antenna farm in May. W1AW Station Manager Joe Carcia, NJ1Q, says the new dipole is oriented to radiate east-west. The "cage" complements a coaxial dipole that's been in use for several years.

Reports on W1AW's 80-meter signal should note your location, time of reception, mode, signal strength and quality. Use of the standard R-S-T system is acceptable.
