DX Dope

We mentioned a couple months back that the occasional 10 and 12 meter daytime openings from such places as Africa and the Indian Ocean were mystifying during protracted periods when the SFI was a rock bottom 65. This prompted your scribe to do some reading and asking around of the more knowledgeable propagation gurus among us. The explanation is most likely due to the occasional solar emissions referred to as proton emissions which often result in sporadic excitation of primarily the F2 layer. Typically, the emission wave enters our atmosphere in a direction towards the North Pole enhancing propagation in the polar regions as the polar ionospheric region is temporarily excited above normal. This is popularly referred to as auroral curtain reflection and often is sufficient to reflect frequencies at 24 MHz and above. Usually, these resulting SFI readings are not reported simply because normal SFI measurements are not carried out in the effected polar and/or outlying polar regions. Obviously, best DX advantage is gained with use of directional antennas which can be beamed towards the auroral curtain. Also, modes other than SSB are easier to copy due to the sometimes nasty flutter which affects voice signals more than others. It should be noted for those of you who know some chemistry, that protons are simply hydrogen ions, i.e. a hydrogen atom which has lost its single circulating electron. Obviously, a swarm of these particles plays havoc with the ionosphere which is typically composed of at-equilibrium electrons and positive ions—the negative electrons immediately being attracted to the “extra” positive proton intruders. This upsets the normal magnetic field equilibrium resulting in very high k and A values and subsequent poor propagation especially on the lower frequencies (160 – 80 meters). Obviously, there is nothing one can do about stopping this phenomenon, hence, simply load up your yagi, aim in northward, and work some new ones on ten and 12 meters.

So, what is out there at this most inappropriate cycle bottom time?
