From ARRL Headquarters West Hartford Conn June 29 1962
To All Radio Amateurs

For all DX workers and amateurs interested in the ARRL Countries List, the following information with effective dates of change in that list is now announced.

Announcement is made of two additions and one deletion. The additions are 1, Ruanda, 2, Urundi, The deletion is Ruanda-Urundi. Confirmations for credit with either Ruanda or Urundi must be dated July 1, 1962 or after. Deletion from the Countries List of Ruanda-Urundi is effective June 30, 1962. DXCC credit claims for either Ruanda or Urundi will not be acceptable until November 1, 1962. For a more detailed announcement of the above see DXCC Notes September 1962 QST.

FCC has denied a petition from WSESZ seeking a change in rules to permit Technician Class operation on the amateur Ten meter band. The Commissions order points out that adoption of the proposal would not fit the concept of the Technician licensee as a VHF experimenter

From ARRL Headquarters West Hartford Conn July 12 1962
To All Radio Amateurs

For many years there has been support among member societies of the IARU of the principle that the bottom 100 KC of the 14 MC band be used exclusively for CW. The European Band Plan embracing this features has been respected and closely observed in most countries, even including those where phone operation between 14 and 14.1 MC is not contrary to regulations. ARRL believes this is an excellent plan and will continue to use its efforts to keep it in effect. Therefore, ARRL announces that effective 0001 GMT on 13 July 1962, DXCC credit will not be given for contacts where either station is operating by telephony, using frequencies between 14 and 14.1 MC

From ARRL Headquarters West Hartford Conn July 20 1962

CONELRAD provisions no longer apply to amateurs. Effective immediately, FCC has deleted Sections 12.190 through 12.196 of the amateur rules. The text of the order will be in September QST.

Vice President Charles Sketchley, K2PQD, opened the meeting at 8:08 PM whence the minutes of the June meeting were read and approved. A balance of \$226.70 was reported on hand and a bill of \$3.54 was submitted to the treasurer. Corresponding Secretary Della Parker, W2AFZ, received some correspondence from the FCC for the publicity Chairman concerning proposed publication of club activities.

Committee Reports

Program- Max, WA2SFY, reported that next months program will be the showing of color slides by W2YNR of his recent trip to ARRL headquarters in Hartford, Conn. Last minute Ham Fest details will be squared away at that time.

TVI- K2PQD mentioned that WA2SFY's neighbor should install a filter in his TV set, for the Ham is 'clean'.

CD-W2KE mentioned the next drill will be on August 24. Also a fine impression and job was done by RACES (CD assisted by GCARC) in the Pitman July 4th parade. We were invited back next year.

Code Class- W2KE mentioned that we were invited to hold our Code classes next year in the Woodbury High School together with other planned courses in conjunction with the Woodbury CD unit. This offer will be studied.

Ham Fest- Paul, W2YNR, reported that the Ham Fest details and planning are shaping up nicely. Max, WA2SFY, needs 3 helpers for swap and shop. In addition, several equipment dealers will be on hand to sell and display equipment. Milt has mailed out 505 post cards. We have now about 60 prizes on hand. Further details will appear in the Crosstalk, XMTR hunt at 1:30; Air show at 3; and drawing at 4PM.

Field Day- All logs should be in to Mal or Don Curtis.

Old Business

Due to lack of summer publishing personnel, the July and August Crosstalks will be combined. We will need a new permanent publisher beginning with Octobers' paper. Milt, WA2ECR, will interview new publisher candidates immediately.

Following much discussion, it was decided to use large club cards to attach to the radio cars as advertisement for the Clayton parade. Milt reported we could obtain 36" square masonite emblems for \$20 (5 emblems). Milt will attach Mobile Radio Unit to each of the "on hand" placards that will be utilized on a trial basis.

Following much discussion, it was decided to allow WA2NPD, and W2KE submit at a future meeting exactly what equipment may be needed and desirable for future code classes.
