Thank you for attending the 1980 HAMFEST of the Gloucester County Amateur Radio Club. It is our pleasure to have you as a visitor. You are welcome to join us and become a member.

You may wish some information on what Gloucester County Amateur Radio Club has to offer its members, and I would like to take this opportunity to give you a brief summary of some of the things we are doing for the Ham fraternity.

First, I would like to point out a little of our club history.

Our club was organized in 1959 and incorporated in the State of New Jersey as a non-profit organization. Several charter members are still active members in the club.

Since 1959 we have had a record of continuous activities, with regular meetings and other club activities. Though we are not a large club, if you will look through the pages of QST you will find our records in most A.R.R.L. events. You will also find that we have participated nearly every year in most A.R.R.L. sponsored operating events. (We have been an A.R.R.L. affiliated club since our inception).

Each year we participate in the Field Day event, and through our Contest Committee, sponsor activities connected with the DX contest, A.R.R.L. Sweepstakes and the V.H.F. Sweepstakes, not to mention the Novice Roundup and various other contests. Our club has for many years sponsored an Amateur Radio Emergency Corps and has supplied the nucleus of personnel for the Civil Defense-R.A.C.E.S. program in Gloucester County.

In the past, club members have put on Amateur Radio demonstrations at various schools and service organizations, as well as providing communications for various Police Departments during the Halloween season. On occasion we have helped with annual clothing drives for Goodwill Industries of Southern New Jersey and have provided communications during "bikathon" and "walkathon" fund raisings for several causes.

We have had a float in Woodbury's annual Halloween parade, and have put on exhibits at the 4-H Fair and participated in Amateur Radio Week in Gloucester County.

On several occasions, our Presidents have given talks regarding our club and Amateur Radio to civic and other organizations.

We provide fraternity and friendship for our members. As our members are from all walks of life including medical doctors, lawyers, ministers, chemists, nurses, secretaries and even household engineers, it would not be long before you would soon become acquainted with those of mutual interest to you. We supply Club QSL cards, at cost, to our members. Our club member identification badges are unique in that they show our club emblem as well as name and call of the member. We have distinctive club jackets and decals for your car and/or shack, along with patches for jacket and/or cap.

We are sincerely interested in helping you get the most out of Ham radio and feel we can do this best by having you join our club. We can be contacted through our Post Office Box No. 370, Pitman, N.J. 08071. Our meetings are held the first Wednesday of each month. We look forward to seeing you again in the not too distant future.

There are two classes of membership available; the Associate membership for non-amateurs or persons not able to actively participate in the club, and Full membership for licensed amateurs.

The cost for Associate membership is a \$1.00 initiation fee plus \$5.00 per year dues. For Full membership a \$3.00 initiation fee plus \$7.50 per year dues. All members are reviewed by our Board of Directors prior to acceptance into the club.

AWARDS COMMITTEE -- Herb Schuler-K2HPV, Awards Chairman

The Gloucester County Amateur Radio Club sponsors a Club award through its Awards Committee. The award is entitled, "WORKED ALL G.C.A.R.C. MEMBERS AWARD". The award is a certificate with appropriate endorsements which is available to members of G.C.A.R.C. who have submitted proof of working on the air at least 15 members of the Club. It is also available to non-members of the Club who submit proof of working at least 10 members. There is no charge for this award.

Proof of having had on-the-air contact with Club members shall be a list showing the following details of each contact:

The Committee will accept hand written lists, typed lists or photocopies of actual logs. The list must clearly show the name, address and call of the person applying for the award. The Certificate is presented when the first 15 members are worked, and seals are provided to be added to the Certificate for 30, 50, and for each 10 members worked beginning with 60. The Committee retains the lists submitted, so as additional members are worked it is only necessary to submit additional lists of proof.

We encourage members and non-members alike to apply for the award. Lists of proof of contact should be sent or delivered to the Chairman

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE - John M. Fisher, K2JF, Chairman

The duties of this committee are primarily devoted to keeping the membership informed of all legislation pertaining to Amateur Radio. This requires the Committee to search for information---the many publications pertaining to Amateur Radio; establish contacts with the ARRL; contacts with the FCC; and inputs from members with regard to local events. Although the Committee is not a legal body or composed of lawyers, it must be able to interpret and reduce to workable plain language, the various legislative happenings and report them to the club members.

One of the important duties of the committee is to encourage the club members to contact the FCC or their local or Federal Congressmen on legislation that affects Amateur Radio. To facilitate this the Committee is required to keep an active list of the people to whom the members may write on such matters.

The Committee is composed of: A member of the Board of Directors and Club members who desire to work on the Committee.

DX COMMITTEE - Wayne Wood, W2SUA, Chairman

Like any other radio club not specifically formed for the purpose of working DX, GCARC has its own group who are chasing the elusive "new ones". The number increases as members find out for themselves the continuing pleasure derived from the sport. Chasing DX usually develops an operator's ability as well as his station capabilities, hence, multi-rig stations with impressive antenna facilities are not uncommon and continue to be developed and improved as experience proves desirable.

Those bitten by the contest bug usually manage to turn up a few new ones to add to their country totals. So, the contest group are part of the DX gang. Working DX is a continuing endeavor filling it between contest and other daily activities.

Advance information can be had concerning DX currently available, including expeditions to rare countries. DX'ers have their own means of communications--word travels quickly when a good one shows up. Mostly there are DX associations who publish bi-monthly bulletins for this purpose. Quite a few GCARC members are subscribers. Then too, it is passed along by telephone, 2 meters and occasional meetings down at "Telfords". This information coupled with propagation reports by John-K2JF, should put the DX'er in good position for the kill.

Several of our members are over the 300 mark for DXCC countries worked and verified while quite a few hold totals of over 200. A larger group have hit the 100 mark and are working daily for higher levels of accomplishment. You can hear the following in the pile-ups:

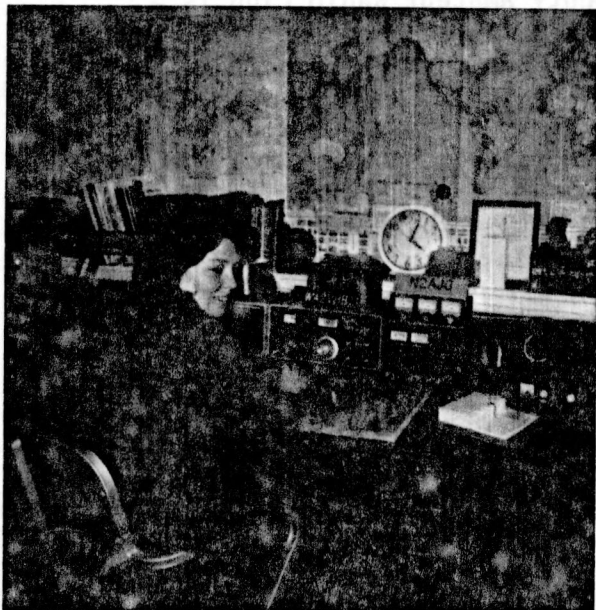

Hope to hear you on the air and also have an eyeball QSO with you during the Hamfest today.

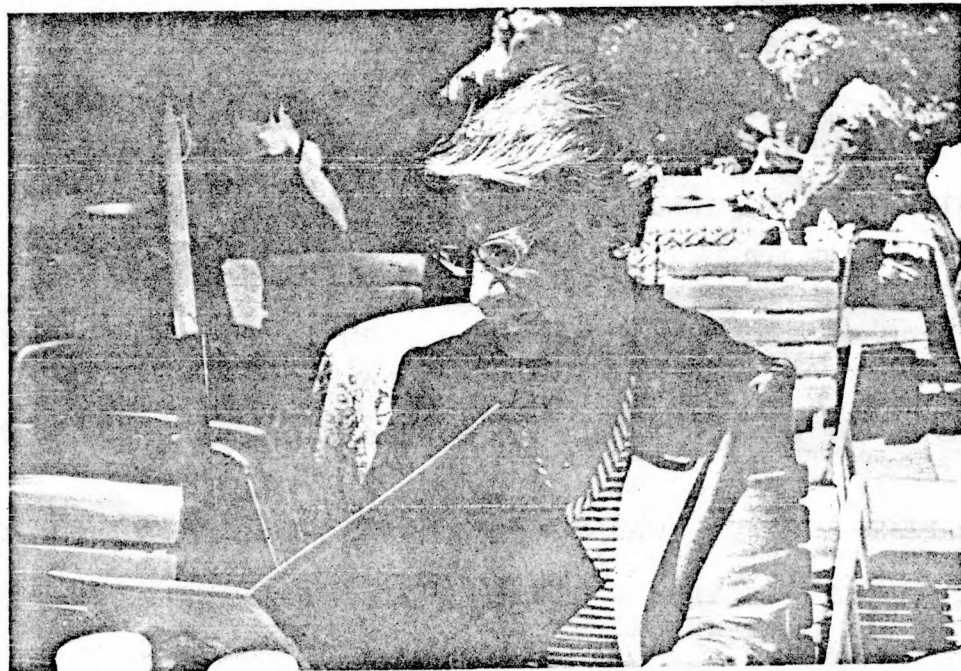
