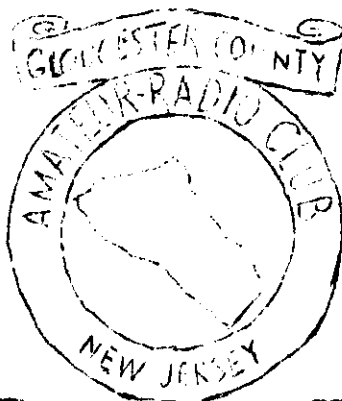

CD

In the CD reports presented by our radio officer (W2KE) at the board of  
directors and club meetings lately have been informing us about all the  
radio equipment and facilities that have been provided by some of the  
townships in Gloucester County. This writer can not help but notice the  
increase in equipment while there is little or no increase in operator  
participation. If we are going to expand the RACES program in the county,  
we will also need more ham operators active in CD. Especially in the town-  
ships that at present have no facilities. The hams should take the  
initiative to get the local governments interested in CD communications.  
(If the hams don't the CB's will or the communications will have to be  
performed by restricted class operators) It is my opinion that RACES is  
just as necessary in the community as the volunteer fire company. It is  
also my opinion that hams have an obligation to the FCC and the community  
to justify their endowed privilege of being a licensed ham. One very good  
way to show appreciation would be to participate in CD activities. A ham  
can provide a far greater civic service in RACES than he can in the usual  
civic associations. There are many non-hams who will do just as good a job  
in those organizations as we could. So lets all pitch in and give our CD  
radio officer a helping hand in establishing communications facilities  
in as many towns and townships as possible in Gloucester County. Everyone  
should be pride to help in CD RACES system that has done so much in the  
relatively short period of time that we have built up the system we now  
have.

To All Radio Amateurs

Canada and Chile have agreed to permit amateurs of the two countries to exchange messages on behalf of third parties. There must be no pecuniary interest, and messages so exchanged must not be important enough to justify transmission by commercial means. Canadian amateurs may also exchange messages with amateurs in the United States, Venezuela, Costa Rica, Honduras and Mexico AR

TO All Amateurs

Radio amateurs of the United States are reminded that communications on behalf of third parties may be exchanged with amateurs in the following countries only: Bolivia, Canada, Chile, Costa Rica, Cuba Ecuador, El Salvador, Haiti, Honduras, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru and Venezuela. Permitted prefixes are CE, CO, CM, CP, EL, HC, HH, HR, K except KA1 through 9, OA, TI, VE, VO, XE, YN, YS, YV AND ZP. Only personnel or technical messages not important enough to justify use of commercial circuits should be handled by amateurs internationally AR

## ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Committee Reports
