

CYCLE 23

The Space Environment Services Center (Boulder, CO-WWV) has confirmed that sunspot group 7910 which appeared on the solar disk in early August has met all the criteria of the beginning of

cycle 23. This criteria includes: reverse polarity, farther away from the equator than those spots of cycle 22, etc. What does this mean to the DXer? First of all, don't expect to see any dramatic changes in propagation for 10-12 and 15 meters for some time to come. Cycle 22 is still the prevailing cycle for probably the next 8 to 9 months.

As more and more sunspot groups from cycle 23 appear, conditions will improve. Experts predict that we could reach the next peak by late 1999 or early 2000. What they don't completely agree on, is how high in sunspot numbers it will peak out at. Some predict a maximum of 110-120 (Cycle 22 peaked at 159) while others predict a peak as high or slightly higher than that of cycle 22. A study of past cycles indicates that odd number cycles usually have higher peaks than those of even number cycles. Basically we'll have to wait and see what Mother Nature delivers us. Whatever it is, it will be an improvement for the high band DXer. With that good news it gives you a little time to get those towers and antennas up for 20 and up. Right now the 20 meter and 17 meter band are doing well.

Low-Bands!

As we have just read from the Solar Cycle report we don't want to forget the Low Band and Top-Band boys. Lately the 40, 80 and 160 meter bands are doing themselves up real well. Much stuff is coming in on 80 CW and SSB. Try listening to the DX holes around 3505-3530 and again 3780-3799 kHz. The stuff is there and workable with 100




watts (CW). If you have the antenna and amp., why you can do wonders right now. Look for the Far East opening around 1145-1215Z on 3797. JA4KFA is generally there with good signal. Also with fair signals are HL9J, JA7EVP, and JF1IST all around 3795 between 1035 and 1300 with the East Coast at 1245Z. Some mornings that Far East hole opens up, but there are times when you are lucky you can get out of your backyard. So take advantage of the winter conditions for the low bands. Rack up your low band DX now why the QRM is low. Get it before the early sun in February! Tks K2JF, John

Problem: Looks like the Heard Island

DXpedition is in trouble. They report that the ship they had chartered is not suitable for the voyage. It seems that the Captain of the ship took their \$100,000 and walked away. The gang is trying to find alternative transportation. Even so, it won't happen until 1996 now. KYFC STATESIDE 40 DX GROUP: John, KD0JL, wants to spread the word that this group "is back on the air" on 7240 +/- 2 at 0700Z. Listen for John or W8LKI. (If your looking for 5BDXCC and you need 40 meter contacts here is a real good place to go. They helped me out.) 3D2RW/R.. Rotuma, Ron, ZL1AMO, active on 40 and 80, and 3D2OQ, Lars, SM5BOQ, along with his XYL, ZK1SSN. Plus a JA group is now going there. These operations should take care of any wants for Rotuma. Usual DX frequencies.

5U7AA.. Niger. This station seems to prefer 15 SSB around 21255-21270 at 1330 to 1530 Z. QSL HH2M. 9N1CT.. Nepal. We have the possible two call set up either 9N1CT or 9N1NQ from Katmandu from Dec. 23 to 31 and will concentrate on 160 meters. I'm not lucky enough to have 160 M capabilities, so I sure hope he comes up on the higher bands. I need this one on CW. A22RV...BOTSWANA, Roger, works 14167 at 1900Z. He runs a 100 watts. QSL direct via P.O. BOX 77, Shashe, Botswana. CE9AP...South Shetlands is active from Chilean antarctic base. Works 20 and 15 CW and SSB. E21CJN.. Thailand. Tham is a computer engineer and a civil engineer who went to school in Memphis, TN for six years. Tham says he is active daily 14000-140025. FK8GP/p, New Caledonia, will be active on Dec. 5 & 6. Then look for him on another Island. FT5XX..Kerguelen. Jean is active on CW/SSB/RTTY on all bands. Standard DX frequencies. QSL via F5NZO. KG4...Guantanamo Bay. KG4ML will be active from Dec. 5th to the 12th. Emphasis will be

placed on WARC BANDS. Also look for KG4JT. HH2/5B4ADA, Haiti, is active and waiting his HH2PK call. HP1/AA4L...Panama. Ellis will be active the first two weeks of December. Says he will

Mainly active on 20 meter SSB near 14260 at 1700Z. He expects to be active on 40 and the WARC bands soon. S92SS...Sao Tome on 160 is very active and was reported recently on 1834 at 2120Z. TR8XX...Gabon on 160. Jean will QSY to 160 on request. Look for him around 1824. VK8NSB..Groote Eylandt (Australia), Dec 22 to Jan 6. He plans CW on 3525, 21135 and 28125 and SSB on 3618 2795,21260, and 28460. VK0GC..Macquarie also VK0WH operates on 20 meter SSB and CW. Usual DX frequencies, VP9CQR & VP8CQS...Polish Antartic Base on King George Island South Shetland. XQ0/JA7AYE & XQ0XQV ... Easter Island. Will be active Dec 30 to Jan3. Active both CW and SSB. Usual DX frequencies. ZA1NG...Albania. Gary operates on all bands on SSB & CW. QSLs will be handled by WA1ECA. ZD9CR...Tristan da Cunha. Jim can be found on 21313 at 1840Z and 14236 around 2110Z. He is usually in the company of either KA1DE or WA2JUN. ZK1..North & South Cook Islands..Look for ZK1ATV, ZK1LIA & ZK1NJX Dec 9-28 South Cook...Dec 28-Jan 4 North Cook. CW 3505, 7005, 10105, 14005, 18075, & 21005... SSB 3795, 7045, 14195, 18145, & 21295. QSL LA1TV. 5N0MVE...Nigeria, active on 160 with "big" signal. He has been reported on 1830 at 2120Z.
