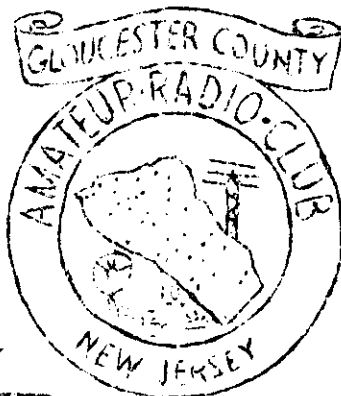

The meeting was called to order at 8:08 PM by president George Stuart, K2SOL.

The minutes of the previous directors meeting were read, corrected, and approved.

Committed Reports

Membership- Ch'ie Hilt Goldman, W2EOR read the applications of Ted Nee, W2MCS, and Ernest Garsibe, W1KJW/W2TBI, and the applications were approved by the board.

Hamfest- Paul Walton, W2YNR, and Doug Gehring, W2MFD, will serve as co-chairmen of the Hamfest activities.

Field Day- Don Curtis, K2UWC, and Mal Mason, W2MFD, will serve as co-chairmen of Field Day.

Treasurers report-(Ted, W2KX et. al. were late) reported that 59 members of the club total 99 had paid their dues officially as of Jan. 1, 1962. Total balance on hand is \$241.57.

Publicity- W2YNR reported that write-ups of the club party and future meeting dates will appear in the Woodbury and Garden papers. Paul will write to 73 and OST to get publishing pictures of the clubs activities.

Special Committee- Charles Sketchley, K2KOB reported about \$35.00 total was spent on the Birthday Party. He will attain a complete, itemized report for future reference. Charles mentioned that the corresponding secretary should send a word of thanks to the women who helped and also to the Kentus Bank for donating the pens. The bills were turned over to the treasurer.

Certificates- Milt Goldman mentioned that stock certificates are difficult to work out and he is thinking of designing one himself.

Code Class- Doug reported that about 12 Novice students will graduate within the next two weeks and from 5 to 10 general class students are approaching 10 and 13 wpm.

VHF Contest- Jim, W2LVW, reported that abt 13,550 points had unofficially been accumulated by participants: W2SFPY, W2YNR, K2IEG, W2LVW, W2IZL, W2HSE, W2UHC, W2MFD, K2AOL, W2KE, and W2CXY. K2FGD has not submitted full report as of now. Jim explained that the more participants, the more point multiples were available for score.

Program- Iax reported (together with confirmation from W2AFZ) that arrangements have been made to have Joe Walsh, an FCC representative, as the guest speaker at the Feb. club meeting. Tentative plans for an Owens-Illinois plant tour and a white elephant sale have been arranged for the March and April meetings respectively.

CD - Van announced that he has a new batch of 2 meter rings on hand for anyone interested. They must be converted to 110 V however.

Old Business

It was decided that a concerted effort should be made on the part of the entire board (and all others interested) to help Mel complete the necessary work to finish the Her Shack. Sat. morning, Feb. 3, at 9 AM is the date for the "finishing off" party. Bring paint brushes and other implements.

Hilt will contact all club members who have, as yet, not renewed their club memberships for 1962.

New Business

Woody, W2AOL, was appointed to serve as acting treasurer for the Feb. club meeting during the temporary absence of Ted.

After much discussion concerning ways and means of increasing the meeting attendance, the motion was made by W2NED to send post card notification to all members for a six month trial period. The motion was over-ruled. It was felt that Cross Talk should be sufficient notification of the meetings.

The membership applications appear to be inadequate in some respects and Hilt will study the application form and suggest revisions where necessary.

Della, W2AFZ, noted an article in the Woodbury Times that all clubs should send in pertinent information regarding the clubs' activities and meetings. This will be done for the paper is apparently preparing a file of the various clubs in the county.

It was generally agreed that all proposed club activities and program proposals be initially turned over to the appropriate club chairman for his evaluation.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:25 PM and delicious refreshments were served by W2SCL's KYL.
