ARRL PROPOSES CHANGES TO BUSINESS RULE

Seeks to alleviate "overly barsh past interpretations" of Part 97

On January 6, the American Radio Relay League presented the FCC with a 14 -page letter that proposes to modify Section 97.113, "Prohibited Transmissions." The FCC may or may not offer the letter for public comment; the agency has not yet decided how to treat it. The letter comes in the wake of controversy over pressure from hams on the FCC to 'loosen up' and legalize more types of communications, or to strictly band them, and speculation on whether the Amateur Service has the "excess capacity" for personal business and broadcast-like uses.

INCREASED NOVICE REPEATER PRIVILEGES PETITION

Dr. Michael C. Trahos KP4PGC, of Alexandria. VA filed a Petition for Rule Making with the FCC on Dec 31st requesting that Novice Class licensees be authorized repeater and repeater control operator privileges. Dr Trahos, a physician and surgeon, is also very active in telecommunications circles. He holds several radio service licenses, including amateur KB4PGC.

BEWARE THE MAILS IN THE NEW CIS

(Commonwealth of Independent States)

The crrent postal situation in Russia and other republics of the CIS (Commonwealth of Independent States) can only be characterized with one word - BAD. For amateurs it means one thing - your letters are being destroyed along the way. Deteriorating standards of living are causing massive mail pilfering by the customs and postal employees there along the route - from the moment that letter arrives into CIS. Earlier in 1991, this problem was confined to the major post offices in cities like Moscow, where mail arrived from abroad for further distribution. Dishonest postal employees, skilled in determining which letters contained valuable enclosures, removed them to supplement their incomes. The problem has gotten worse since local post offices joined the 'feeding frenzy'. 'Finding' 10 bucks is equal to a month worth of good wages! No letter is safe....

My contacts complained that they have received no mail for several months now, where there were dozens upon dozens before. Letters that do arrive come torn, without enclosures and often without cards. The problem has gotten so bad that it was addressed in the Moscow newspaper 'Megapolis Express', dated November 14, 1991. It quotes Russian postal employees, pointing fingers at 'subversive Western HAMS, who put small banknotes in letters to their Soviet counterparts, thus leading postal employees into irresistible temptation'. Furthermore, Vice Director of Moscow's Central Post Office, Mr. Sergeev, is concerned that pilferage occurs at Shermetyevo airport, even before the mailbags fall into skillful hands of his colleagues and subordinates. No one is making a mystery that mail disappears on all stages of its' movement to the

addressee - there is no control what-so-ever. The Central Post Office has its' own mystery - Room #3, where mail is brought. Nobody - neither postal administration, nor customs authorities - are willing to explain what happens behind those doors.

Well, once again we are faced with the question - How to get QSL cards out of Russia and other republics. Here are a few suggestions, given to me by my friends overthere:

* BY ALL MEANS, AVOID FLASHY ENVELOPES AND STAMPS.

Make your letter appear as plain as possible - use metered mail instead of stamps; forget about 'AIRMAIL' envelopes! Use plain, opaque envelopes instead.

* ANY CALLSIGN ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE ENVELOPE IS A DEAD GIVE-AWAY Yours or the Addressees!

Write you name and address by hand. Don't use labels or stamps at all. Don't mention 'RADIO' or 'CLUB'.

* SEAL ENVELOPES WITH SYNTHETIC GLUE WHICH WITHSTANDS STEAM OR HEATING, DO NOT RELY ON THE ENVELOPES' GLUE TO DO THE JOB.

Postal thieves are very skilled in opening envelopes without leaving traces. Synthetic glue makes their 'job' difficult, if not impossible, and they may just leave your mail alone.

* USE SCOTCH THE TO SEAL SEAKS!

After the letter is sealed with glue, use scotch tape. Be generous with tape around other seams, edges, on the front and the back of the envelope. It just may work.

" IF YOU CAN GET YOUR HANDS ON KUSSIAN-MANUFACTURED ENVELOPES, BY ALL MEANS USE THEM!

Even though addressing will be done in English and the stamp would be foreign, such envelopes have a better chance of slipping by. Only addresses' address goes on the front of the envelope, in the upper right side. Leave the lower right side unfilled (that's where senders' address normally goes). Write your address on the back - or avoid writing it altogether.

* SENDING CURRENCY TO THE CIS IS LEGAL - BUT AVOID IT!

This is rather unanimous opinion of everyone I spoke to. It is possible that thieves are using some sort of devices, like 'currency testers' sold to \$30 in this country. Testers detect metal particles in dollar bills. Not every dishonest postal employee may have this gadget, but why take changes? Use IRCs instead. Your enclosures are best secured by another opaque envelope inside. Use a smaller size envelope. Folding it will immediately bring unwanted attention.

*REGISTERED MAIL STILL MAKES IT OK!

If you can spend the money, this may be the way for you. Aforementioned advice still applies, though.

The problem is so bad, that mail disappears even inside republics or when letters are mailed from one republic to another. CIS hams mailing reply letters to you are subject to the same 'scrutiny'!!!

I hope you find this advice helpful and worth your reading. I welcome your comments and suggestions. Good luck with those cards!

ABOUT WWV

Most radio amateurs keep their station logs in "GMT" or "ZULU" time. This is generally understood as being the time in Greenwich, England, and it is the time given by many "standard time and frequency stations such as WWV in Fort Collins, Colorado. Although almost every radio ham and SWL has tuned in WWV on 2.5,5.0,10.0,15.0, or 20.0 MHz (or, WWVH in Kauai, HI which operates on 2.5,5.0,10.0 and 15 MHz), very few are familiar with the range of services these stations provide. In addition to the solar flux announcements, there are calibrated audio tones and other timing signals, plus other announcements. Standard audio tones of 500 and 600 Hz occupy 45 seconds worth of alternate minutes. An 800 ms burst of 1000 Hz begins each minute, and 1500 Hz begins each hour. 440 Hz (musical "A" above middle "C") has a minute all its own, each hour. Did you know that the clock "ticks" heard on the stations are actually precise 5 ms bursts of 1000 Hz audio? The double ticks almost always heard near the beginning of each minute tell the difference between UTC and the astronomical time, called "UT1," defined by the earth's rotation. Each double tick indicates 0.1 second of difference. By the way, if you cannot receive these stations on the air, you can dial in via landline (303) 499-7111 (WWV) and (808) 335-4363 for WWVH. THESE CALLS ARE NOT FREE ! For more information on WWV (and "sister" stations WWVH and WWVB), write for the publication "NIST Time and Frequency Services" -- Special Publication 432. available from U.S. Department of Commerce, Radio Station WWV, 2000 East County Road 59. Fort Collins CO 80524.

To All Radio Amateurs,

New Jersey has changed its law regarding the possession of radios in motor vehicles. On Monday, January 20, Governor James Floio signed New Jersey Law S-305, superseding a law that had been on the books since 1926. Under S-305 it no longer is a crime for private citizems, including radio amateurs, to have in their vehicles a radio capable of scanning governmental frequencies. Efforts to change the law were spearheaded by members of the ARRL volunteers field organization.

Under the old law, it was illegal for amateurs to carry in their cars VHF or UHF ham transceivers capable of tuning to police and fire frequencies near the ham bands. Even transporting a scanner radio by car from a retail store to one's home technically was a crime. The new law still makes it a criminal offense to use such a radio to gather information for the commission of a crime. Possession of such a radio at the time of arrest for a crime is considered de facto evidence of its use in the commission of the crime.

The new law does not apply to simple traffic infractions such as speeding.

New Jersey law S-305 was drafted by ARRL Volunteer Counsel Frank Terramella, N2IGO. Other amateurs assisting in its presentation were Volunteer Counsel John Norton, M2IOB and ARRL Hudson Division Assistant Director John Burgio, W2JB. Others who contributed to the successful campaign were:


