### **W2MMD Adds 1200 MHz to Its Repeater System**

The Pitman water tower is now home to 3 W2MMD repeaters. On the tower with the 2M and 70cm machines is the new 23cm machine. The frequencies are 1284.4 output, 1272.4 input. The repeater was built by KB2AYU. It consists of a Hamtronics vhf receiver and vhf exciter coupled with a SSB Electronic 23cm low noise receive converter and 23cm 1 Watt transmit converter. A Down East Microwave power amp puts out 60 watts through Wacom duplexers. A Comet high gain vertical antenna is topside. Initial results indicate a big signal over the surrounding area, with very good receive sensitivity. The biggest problem at 23cm is multipath distortion, especially when in motion from a mobile. Experiments with diversity reception are planned to try and tame the multipath problem.

# DX Dope

Thus far, the VU7LD “DX ride” has been extremely tough, a real DXers challenge and hurdle. Unless you have a few 100 ft. plus towers with multi-element beams and long wires attached at about the same height, chances are you won’t have him in your log very often. Looking at their on-line search, we see some of the USA “big guns” have him on the most workable bands, but the rest of us are lucky to have worked him on any band. And, as you read this, the operation, after going strong for the month of December, is about to shut down. The good news is the second group will be there starting about January 15 until the end of the month. So how can you work them? About the only time they are readable here in southern New Jersey, is between the hours of about 8 AM and 10 PM on 20, 17, and occasionally 15 meters. If you have a beam, listen on the long path (about 260 deg.) between 8 AM and 9 AM, and then go short path (about 80 deg.) for the next hour. This is true for 20, 15, and 17m. 15 m has only been open for 15 minutes or so for very few days, so best luck is on 20 m. 17 m has been very poor the past 2 weeks as the SFI has now dropped to the low seventies. 80 meters and 40 meters have been sporadically heard in the early evening hours between 6:30 and 7:30 PM, and that’s about it. High k values have plagued these two low bands for about half of the operation thus far. All times given here are in EST and are approximate at best. Also, note that most of their operations are SSB, some CW. Propagation has been much better to the 4 and 5 call areas, but, unfortunately, we don’t live down there. Oh, having an amplifier is a big help, however, towards the final week, not so critical. As we sink deeper and deeper into the 11 year cycle bottom (bottom now calculated to be in May, 2007), the above propagation situation will most likely be the same for the second VU7 operation. VU7/L is the second most needed entity in the world. Good luck, and have lots of patience.

The ARRL Outgoing DX Bureau prices go up after first of the year. Ten cards will now be \$1.50, up 50 cents, for example. So, what else is out there?

## W2MMD Completes First EME (Moon Bounce) Contacts

The GCARC club station W2MMD, operated by Jim, N2NRD, and Al, KB2AYU, completed 9 EME contacts on 144 MHz during the 2006 ARRL EME contest. The new WSJT computer soundcard based digital mode was used to pull the weak signals out of the noise. The club equipment consists of a Yaesu FT-847, a M2 17 element long boom yagi, a SSB Electronic tower mounted low noise preamp, and a generic 500Mhz computer. KB2AYU's power amp was used for about 700W output. Stations could be heard from as soon as the moon cleared the horizon, up to 30 degrees above the horizon. Big gun stations in both Europe and the US were worked including: RN6BN, EA6VQ, RA3AQ, RU1AA, IK3MAC, S52LM, K5GW, KB8RQ, and W5UN. For your information, the total path length to the moon and back is almost 500,000 miles!
