Down Jersey DXing

While watching one of the DX clusters on a snowy Saturday afternoon, the question occurs as to what to expect DX-wise for radio conditions in the year 2010. Frankly, it seems we know less about this new sunspot cycle now than we did a year ago. Cycle 24 has gotten stranger as the 2009 has unfolded.

A huge sunspot just traversed the sun's earth-side face during this past week raising the Solar Flux to an 84! That's about the highest it has been in a year or more, but you sure could not tell much of difference in propagation on 20 through 10 meters the past week! Conditions seemed to be better with around a 74 number for the Solar Flux during the last week in November during CQ WW DX Contest, especially on 15 Meters. Wonder what the big spot might have done for us on 6 Meters this past June?

Guess the best answer to this situation is to check the cluster, check the Solar Flux and check the bands with your ears! Nothing beats listening to really tell you what is going on with propagation. We are still having some very narrow band openings to different parts of the world on different bands at times. The DX is there, but you need to be there too!

40 through 160 Meters have quieted down quite a bit now that we are in the winter season. Early sunsets and late sunrises take the edge off listening for some nice "gray-line" openings on these bands at this point of our Northern Hemisphere calendar.

For you occasional DXers, don't forget to keep your envelope credits on file with the W2 QSL Incoming Bureau. All the details about the bureau are at the ARRL website. With so many of the club members paying League dues, take advantage of this inexpensive service! I have had my gripes about the bureau from time to time, but overall it has given me many thousands of DX confirmations over the years. I just received a bureau card this week from UT5UGR looking for a conformation from me for a qso on 17 Meters made in 1998. Neat part is, I was living in Connecticut back then and worked the guy from Princeville, Hawaii on the Big Island while I was vacationing there. He'll be getting the confirmation even after 11 years!

With the major holidays behind us, more DX travel should ensue a ramp up of our possibilities for a new one. Let's comb January's upcoming DXpedition data for some exotics worth hunting for:

Philadelphia Wireless Law

Effective December 1, the City of Philadelphia's new law prohibiting the operation of "wireless devices" went into effect. Although the rationale behind the law addresses "mobile telephones", the final text paints broad strokes and prohibits anything that can be considered a "wireless device".

This regulation made it through the entire legislative process with out any consideration for Amateur Radio or other types of non-governmental 2-way communications equipment usage. The vague language in certain areas of the act appear to prohibit the use of GPS receivers and garage door remotes as well.

While the spirit of such legislation certainly has merit, the execution leaves something to be desired and given the increasing ways in which state/commonwealth and local governments are looking for any income sources possible, Philadelphia will surely be searching for every opportunity to enforce this new high-profile law and collect fines. Until an exemption for Amateur Radio is added in, you may well be wise to just leave the rig off until you are outside the city/county line. Hopefully, "someone" in Pennsylvania is working on this correction.


