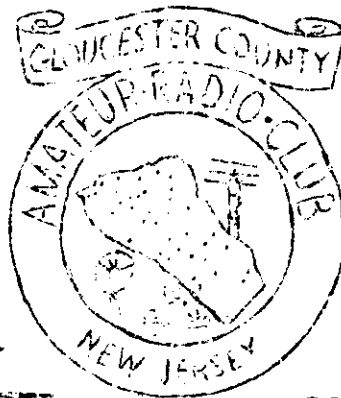

The CD drill of Dec. 9th was a success. There were four mobiles and our CD bus in operation in Glassboro. The control center at Woodbury was also manned to relay traffic to Trenton. The CD bus was located on the college campus, the scene of a simulated fire. All of the mobiles and the bus were using narrow band FM on Two meters with a 60 watt base station in Woodbury. AM was used between Woodbury and Trenton. Trenton later reported that our 2 meter AM signal was the most outstanding signal in the state. This is no doubt a result of the new 100 foot tower that was recently installed at the CD center for our antennas. The drill was profitable to us in RACES by revealing to us a need for some minor improvements in future planing of our communications system.

HOME BREW CONTEST

The Home Brew Contest was held as planned at the Dec. meeting. There were a total of four entries participating. Two entries were displayed in the Advanced Division. Hally W2PID presented a complete 18 watt Six meter phone rig. Woody K2MQL presented a five band rig with VFO featuring the new British Eddystone dial. Eric WA2FHO entried an 813 Five band switched CW rig in the Intermediate group. In the Junior Division Allen WA2RFO presented a 5 band VFO that oscillates on 80 or 40 meters.

The home brew contest will now be an annual event with awards given in each Division. It is hoped that there will be many more contenders to enter into the competition for the next home brew event. A suggestion to anyone entering the next contest would be building some simple test equipment or gimmick that is useful around the shack. I am sure there is no one in this club who has every piece of test gear that he will ever need within his possession. Home brewing has been a traditional part of ham radio since the being and is one of the most satisfying phases of the hobby.
