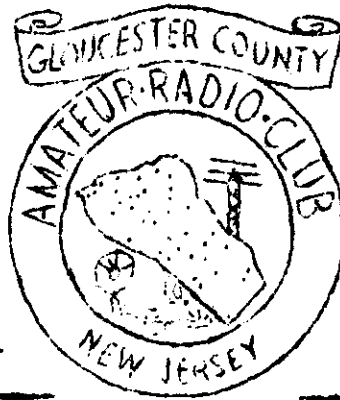

The meeting was called to order by president Mel Hason at 8:02 PM. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. Treasurer Tad Deuber, W2CKX, reported a balance of \$264.25 and several bills were paid. Corresponding Secretary Della Parker, W2AFZ, reported that Almo Radio desires a Club History and Paul Walton, W2YNR, assisted by Doug Gehring, WA2NPD, will compile such a history. In addition, all FCC license applications will not be processed at Gettysburg, Pa., and acknowledgement was received from the ARRL thanking us for the \$25.00 donation. Minutes of a special Board of Directors meeting held on 6/6/62 were read. The following motion was passed. "Those members in arrears as of June 6, 1962 will be continued as members in good standing upon payment of all dues in arrears without payment of initiation fee, provided such dues are paid by Sept. 5, 1962.

Committee Reports

Membership- K2PCD reported that William Gelke, W2RND, and Robert Tulley, W2TTA, have applied for Full Membership.

Awards- W2AFZ informed that Charley coder, and Wally Martin have qualified for club certificates.

TVI- K2PCD related an amusing, somewhat sad tale of recent tvi experiences involving one of our own Board members--who, incidently, is planning to move in order to escape the complantee.

CD- W2LJ reported that the next scheduled drill will be held on July 13, and a special drill will be held on the 4th of July.

Ham Fest- W2YNR reported much progress especially on publicity. A price of \$36 per 6 soft drink tanks was obtained. Eric Wolfbrandt will be in charge of selling hot dogs. WA2ECR presented small size posters for car window display, and he will also have printed arrows for directions.

Publicity- W2YNR has distributed letters to various papers advertising Field Day, the Club picnic, and Ham Fest.

Field Day- all stations must be 2000 ft. apart and operators are still needed.

Old business

Milt, WA2ECR, also has replicas of the Ham Fest posters on Post Cards to be mailed out to outlying areas. As only 20 favorable replies would pay for mailing 500 such cards the idea was vigorously welcomed. It was suggested that the Coffee chairman should appoint an assistant. The certificates to the Homebrew contest winners will be presented at the August meeting. It was strongly mentioned that all outstanding club property should be returned and maintained with the Club Custodian.

W2NPD reported that the Club will participate in the 75th Anniversary parade at Clayton on August 18. 5 or 6 mobiles on 6M are needed. GCARC will handle all communications associated with the parade and any other parades where Radio Communications are desirable.

WA2NPD presented a motion to require a 5 dollar deposit from all prospective Code Class students in the Fall, the deposit to be returned in full at completion of the Course. The deposit to be forfeited in event the student were to completely disappear from the classes. The motion was defeated.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:45 PM and excellent refreshments were served by Della assisted by Mary, Tad's XYL.
