I accepted Larry's invitation to begin participating here mostly so that I could provide GEnie users with the same services and support that ARRL HQ provides to the other on-line services.

What support, you ask? Well, as most ARRL members know very well, we have over a hundred free services that we provide from ARRL Hq. My time and energy on the various on-line services is but one. I hope you'll find it to be of value.

I routinely provide support to all takers (but especially to new-comers & would-be Amateur Radio operators on Prodigy, Compuserve, the BIX network, the Internet, and America On Line. Also, I'm the SYSOP of the ARRL BBS(203 665-0090) and have been for almost five years now.

It's my job at ARRL HQ to provide support to:

- 1. The ARRL National Traffic System
- 2. The ARRL Amateur Radio Emergency Service
- 3. The ARRL's Amateur Auxiliary to the FCC's Field Operations
 Bureau
- 4. The ARRL Field Organization

I fully expect to provide other types of very interesting support to GEnie participants as well. Many of you are already familiar with the very popular ARRL "Prospective Ham Package" that our Educational Activities Department provides to newcomers. SB QST ARL ARLB043 ARLB043 FCC grants K3VOA

The FCC has granted the Voice of America Amateur Radio Club station in Washington, D.C. the call sign K3VOA. Although specific call signs for amateur stations have not been available for more than a decade (FCC Rule 97.17 f), FCC Chairman, Alfred Sikes, made an exception for the Voice of America club in this, the 50th anniversary year of the VOA. The license was issued May 7, replacing K3EKA as the club's call sign.

In granting the special request, Sikes noted that several other countries, including Belize and the Philippines, have granted special VOA-suffix call signs to amateur club stations connected with VOA transmitter sites. The club had lobbied for the call for more than a decade.

H.R. 73, the U.S. House of Representatives Amateur Radio Spectrum Protection Act, now has 176 co-sponsors. The bill's sponsor, Representative Jim Cooper of Tennessee, said recently that he and Senator Al Gore, also of Tennessee and sponsor of the companion senate bill, are working together to obtain passage of the bills this year.

Cooper, in a recent letter to a constituent who had voiced concern about another amateur's complaint about the bill's potential for encroaching on the FCC's authority to assign spectrum, said that the American people don't elect the FCC to set telecommunications policy. They elect the Congress to do that. The FCC was set up by Congress, Cooper wrote, to carry out the policies that the American people enact through their elected representatives. H.R.73 would contribute an important policy to our telecommunications law by setting aside the existing 'ham' bands as a sort of 'public park' for average citizens to enjoy.

New Jersey Scanner Laws Now on the Books. I just received my New Jersey Criminal Law updates and this is the new statutes that will be enforced.

2C:33-21. Interception of Police, Fire or Emergency Medical Communications, With Criminal Intent.

Any person who intercepts any message or transmission made on or over any police, fire or emergency medical communications system, or any person who is a recipient of information so intercepted, and who uses the information obtained thereby to facilitate the commission of or the attempt to commit a crime or a violation of any law of this State, or uses the same manner which interferes with the discharge of police operations, shall be guilty of a crime of the fourth degree.

2C:33-22. Possession of Radio Capable of Receiving Police, Fire or Emergency Medical Communications While in the Commission of a Crime.

Any person who, while in the course of committing or attempting to commit a crime, including the immediate flight therefrom, possesses or controls a radio capable of receiving any message or transmission made on or over any police, fire, or emergency communications system, shall be guilty of a crime of the fourth degree.

2C:33-23. Police, Fire or Emergency Medical Communications System Shall Not Include Radar Devices.

System Shall Not Include Radar Devices. For purposes of P.L.1991, c432(C.2C:33-22), the term "police fire or emergency medical communications system" shall not include radar devices used to monitor vehicular speed.
