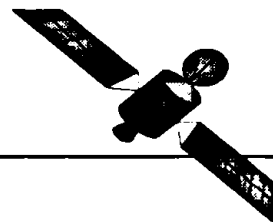

DX REPORT

—K2JF

Well, we had some fun chasing ZS50PAX, who, by the way, is still running, as was mentioned in last month's CROSSTALK. Also, ZL8/G4MFW, Kermadec Is. -- all on 100 watts on 20 CW. 1A5S - Sparviero Reef will be in operation from June 9-11. Operation on 40 thru 6 meters. W4 - Dry Trotugas from June 21-26 -- a group of four U.S. Amateurs. Look for N4BP who will

operate QRP on Field Day June 24-25, CW, 80 thru 10 meters. Outside of Field Day they will use KR4GJ at 100 watts. 3V8BB - Tunisia, YTIAD has been operating here. Usually CW and look for him on the usual DX frequencies. 9X/ON4WW - RWAANDA - 160 schedule - Mark has modified his schedule for working 160. For US look for him at 0330-Z on 1827 (just before his sunrise.) VE2 - Zone 2 - John VE2PR is actually QRV from Mistassini Lake, Zone 2, and he is particularly active on lower edge of 80 meter DX band. D44BC-Cape Verde Is. - GJ4ICD will activate this one June 1-13, 160 thru 6 meters. This is primarily a 6 meter operation. 7Q7TT - Malawi - Peter, ON6TT, a telecom consultant for the Red Cross will be operational 'till June 11. He will have RTTY equipment with him. VF1L - Special Event - Cape Breton Is. June 1-Aug 31, QSL VE1AL. V31RD - Belize will be active 'till June 8 with emphasis on 6 meters, with low band activity when 6 is not open. By the way, listen on 20 meters in the morning. JA,BY,BV,HL are coming in about 1100 to 1200Z good signals. Listen to JA4KFA (Sam) on 14165 kHz, very FB signal. TNX QRZ DX, and other DX amateurs. DON'T FORGET JUNE 10-12 ARRL June VHF QSO Party JUNE 17-18 All Asian Contest - CW JUNE 24-25 FIELD DAY.

BAYMOO

BayMOO, an all-text virtual reality on the NET, has just completed an installation of a room that allows people to listen to AND send transmissions to packet radios all over the world. The room allows the non-ham visitor to see transmissions coming into BayMOO via server link, with hundreds of packet end nodes all over the world. Americans are in a minority; so if you speak French, German, Spanish or Portuguese, all the better! Hams can be give a call-sign property by the room's owners. They can then transmit, and their transmissions are automatically prefaced with their callsigns. The MOO environment makes transmission and legibility a breeze. It's truly a breath-taking experience, and a big leap for Hams with an internet connection.

To get to BayMOO, telnet to this address: baymoo.sfsu.edu 8888. If you just want to look around for the day, or for a couple of days, use your call-sign as your guest login name. If you want a permanent character, write to rk@worldbit.com, and tell him you want your callsign as your BayMOO "handle." When you log into BayMOO, just follow instructions. Type HELP MOVEMENT and HELP COMMUNICATION for the basics. Then type @go Virtual Ham Central, which will transport you to the packet room. You will need to have either Akira or Dr.J give you a property that allows you to transmit, and that automatically prefaced your transmissions with your callsign.

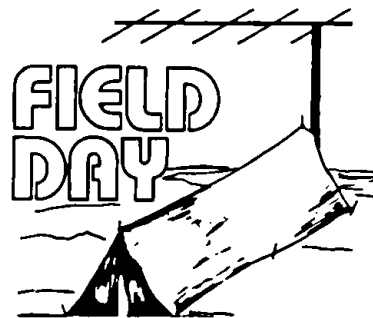

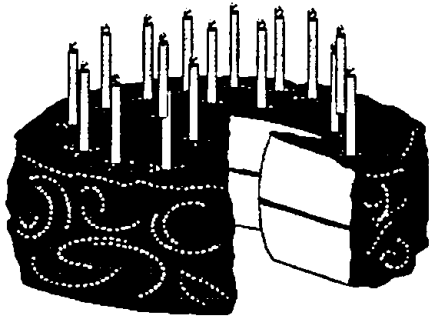

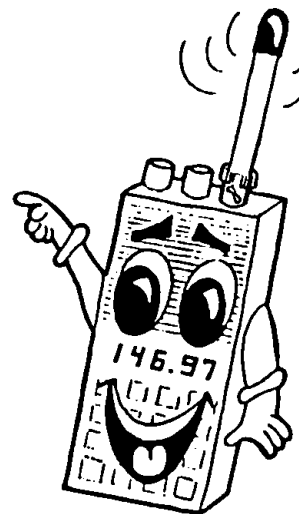
