





### Talk About a Cool Site!

The other day your editor was "surfing about" the Internet under the broad topic of "amateur radio" and lo, behold, and gee wizz, did I find an interesting site: the NIH Radio Amateur Club, K3YGG,

which operates from the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, MD.

The Club's homepage describes its mission as "prin-

cipally a volunteer group sponsored by the Division of Public Safety at the NIH." Chartered during the Cold War era, the page explains, the Club supported Civil Defense activities and continues today to be heavily involved in public safety, emergency, and public service operations.

"NIHRAC has an emergency communications center (EEC) with a wide range of communications gear," to quote again from the homepage. Five operating positions are available, with complete HF stations, a KW amplifier, and associated station gear.

But what I found especially interesting about this site is the online (listening only) access it provides to over a dozen amateur repeaters in Maryland and Virginia, as well as access to the National

### QST DE W!AW

Bulletin 28 from ARRL Headquarters Newington CT May 30, 1997 Congress Acts to Protect Volunteers

The US House and Senate have passed companion bills aimed at shielding volunteers from lawsuits resulting from their activities as volunteers. The Senate has passed S 544, and the House has passed a companion bill, HR 911, each described as "The Volunteer Protection Act of 1997." The Senate is expected to adopt the House version of the bill and send to President Clinton for signature.

As a result, volunteers of nonprofit organizations and government entities will, in the words of the House Judiciary Committee report on the bill, "generally be relieved of liability for harm caused if the volunteer was acting within the scope of the volunteer's responsibilities."

This will be good news to Volunteer Examiners, Official Observers, ARES and RACES volunteers and others working under the sponsorship of a qualifying non-profit organization, all of whom appear to be covered by HR 911. The pending new law means that you aren't as likely to be sued as a result of harm unintentionally caused to someone else, if your actions were part of your responsibilities as a volunteer working on behalf of a government agency or a non-profit organization.

Weather Service in Washington, DC, the Dulles International Airport Tower, and the Washington National Airport Tower!

How does this work? Through the magic of JAVA programming language, "hot buttons" are available for each radio service that automatically tune the club's Icom IC-R7000 receiver (frequency range of 25 mhz to 2.0 ghz). Also, you can set your own frequency.

For the technical buffs, the club gives the following lingo: "From the IC-R7000, radio control is via a serial link to a Pentium PC running Red Hat Linux 4.0. Audio streaming is via a shielded audio cable to a Sun SPARC 20 running Solaris 2.5. The Linux computer runs the web server."

Just for the heck of it, I set the receiver to 147.180 and then keyed the repeater with my HT to see if I could hear W2MMD (it was one of those "long-skip," warm days, and I thought maybe I'd get through). Nothing heard ... well, that's quite a trip from our area to DC.

Anyway, this is a great example of the marriage between the Internet and amateur radio. You may be wondering about transmitting access (there is none on this repeater). Of course, unless the user is a licensed ham, broadcast through the remote repeater would be a violation of FCC rules. I don't know of any "Gateway" operations like this one where licensed hams can go from the Internet to the airwaves. Do you?

"Volunteer," continued...

Amateurs and other volunteers are advised that until the bill is signed by the President and its various loopholes pass the scrutiny of the legal community, they should not assume they'll automatically be covered. It appears, for example, that ham volunteers not working under the sponsorship of a qualifying organization and who provide communication during a marathon, bicycle race or other public service or public safety event might not be covered.

The same exclusion might apply to frequency coordinators and certain others who—though they are volunteers—aren't participating on behalf of a non-profit entity. The law will clearly protect only those who are "volunteers of a non-profit organization or government entity." The definition is less clear with respect to "non-profit organizations." These can be Section 501(c)(3) entities, that is, an organization holding a certain tax exemption from the IRS. But, they also include those organizations which may not be tax-exempt, but which are organized and conducted for public benefit and operated primarily for charitable, civic, educational, religious, welfare, or health purposes.

The growing reluctance of private citizens to volunteer for fear of lawsuits triggered interest in this legislation. Some states have enacted volunteer protection statutes, but inconsistency among the various state laws prompted the League to promote liability legislation in Congress, initially to protect VEs and Amateur Auxiliary members.

The new legislation requires that the volunteer be licensed, certified or authorized, "if appropriate or required" by state or local authorities. It does not provide protection where the ham was caused by willful or criminal misconduct, gross negligence, reckless misconduct, or conscious, flagrant indifference to rights or safety of the individual(s) harmed by the volunteer. The House version of the legislation would not cover any volunteer who inadvertently caused harm to another person while operating a motor vehicle that requires an operator license or insurance. Also, certain limitations in existing state volunteer liability laws are not preempted by the Federal protection under the bill.

ARRL General Counsel Chris Imlay, W3KD, is studying copies of the House and Senate bills to determine the impact of the new legislation on Amateur Radio volunteers. NNNN /EX
