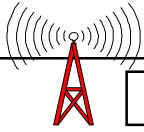

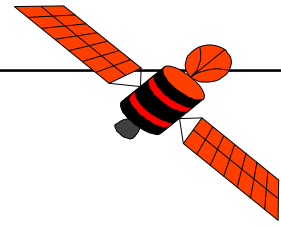

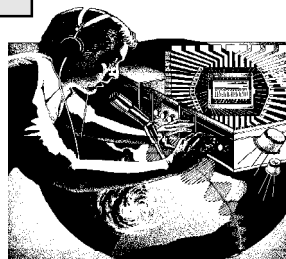

## King Hussein, JY1, SK

Radio amateurs around the world joined in mourning the death over the weekend of Jordan's King Hussein, JY1. Hussein, 63, died Sunday morning. The Middle East's longest-reigning ruler, he'd been Jordan's king for

47 years, taking the throne when he was just a teenager. His son, Abdullah, 37, succeeds him.

Hussein was a life member of the ARRL. ARRL Executive Vice President David Sumner, K1ZZ, called him "an enthusiastic radio amateur whose support was invaluable to us in obtaining new amateur bands at the 1979 World Administrative Radio Conference." Sumner recalled that in May 1979, International Amateur Radio Union President Noel Eaton, VE3CJ, was invited to Amman to meet with King Hussein.

"Jordan's support of the Amateur Service was much in evidence at the conference that fall, and was a crucial element in our success," Sumner said. The WARC-79 resulted in Amateur Radio's gaining the 30, 17, and 12-meter bands. That same year, JY1 was featured in the film, "The World of Amateur Radio." Hussein regarded his 1983 contact with Owen Garriott, W5LFL, on board the Space Shuttle Columbia, as a high point in his Amateur Radio activity.

King Hussein also participated in the historic 1995 joint Israel-Jordan JY74X operation on Mt Nebo, where hams from both countries participated in a Field Day-like operation. The King put in appearances both on the air and in person, much to the delight of the participants and those waiting to work him and JY74X.

He will be missed by all.

## DXCC NEWS RELEASE

New DXCC Entity Added

The International Telecommunication Union, in its Operational Bulletin No. 685 of February 1, 1999, has allocated the callsign prefix E4 for use by Palestine. This is in accordance with the Resolution PLEN/3 of the Plenipotentiary Conference of the ITU held in Minneapolis, Minnesota in 1998.

Palestine will be added to the DXCC List effective

October 1, 1999. Contacts made with E4 stations after February 1, 1999, will count for this new entity.

## Bouvet Island - 3Y

Bouvet Island is one of the most wanted countries on the DXCC list and not very accessible due to several reasons. The Norwegian Polar Institute has just issued a discussion document concerning a proposed new legislation on the island making it more difficult or maybe impossible to mount future dxpeditions. Now is the time to react!

The LA-DX-GROUP and the Norwegian Radio League(NRRL) have been invited to voice their opinion. We need as many responses as possible before February 15. Please help us with all positive arguments for allowing amateur radio activity on the island in the future.

1. The purpose of the proposed new law is to protect the wildlife(seals and seabirds) in the "Nyroeysa" area on the northwest coast of the island. The area is about 1500 m long and up to 300 m wide. The size of the whole island is 50 square km of which 90% is covered by ice.

2. During the period November 1 to March 15 each year it will not be possible to use the "Nyroeysa" area for any ham related activities. In addition there are

severe restrictions on the use of helicopters for the period March 15 to May 1. "Nyroeysa" is the only possible location of a dxpedition and the November to March period is the time frame suitable for dxpeditions.

## E44DX meets with Yasser Arafat

In their first 48 hours of operation, the E44DX Palestine DXpedition team has logged more than 10,000 QSOs, much to the delight of DXers around the world. The absolute highlight for the team, however, has been their meeting with Palestinian leader Yasser Arafat. Expressing his support for ham radio, Mr. Arafat sent his regards to the worldwide amateur community.

E44DX is keeping two stations on the air with Yaesu FT-1000MP radios, FinnFet amplifiers and several dipole and vertical antennas. Power has been limited to 400 W or less, due to interference with the hotel's telephone system.

Beginning at 0000Z Friday, 19 February, the team will concentrate on 7 Mhz CW all night. Additionally, E44DX will be active on 21 MHz CW all day Friday, with particular regional concentration as follows:

06-1000Z - Japan

10-1300Z - Europe

13-1600Z - U.S.A. (especially W6/W7 as possible)

The E44DX call sign has been assigned to the newly formed amateur radio society in Palestine--the Palestinian Amateur Wireless Society. Arrangements are being made to leave behind equipment for the new society's club station, assuring continued amateur radio activity from Palestine.

## Amateur Radio Emergency Service Field Manual

Published by the American Radio Relay League  
Newington, CT \$5.00

The ARES Field Manual won't be found on the New York Times Bestseller list, but should find its way into your ARES "ready kit". Don't know what goes in a ready kit? Pages 8 through 10 talk all about it.

Not being a book in the conventional sense, the Field Manual is more a spiral bound collection of forms, checklists, and reference information. How fast are the average winds in a Category 3 hurricane? 111 to 130 MPH according to the Saffir/Simpson Hurricane Scale on page 59. While some of the checklists may seem to be common sense items, common sense isn't very common in the excitement of an ARES call up. Have you ever forgotten that PL259 to BNC adapter to connect your handheld to a fixed base antenna? I know I have (thanks Dad, for having one in your kit)!

The included forms are very handy. I never thought to keep an incident log to recall what I did at a later date, but there are about 20 of them bound in the manual. There are sheets for keeping emergency names and contact phone numbers handy, and a form to record repeater frequencies and CTCSS tones. Murphy may have you reprogramming your handheld with a flashlight by the side of the road, at least you won't have to try to remember the PL tone for the repeater.

The plastic laminate covers, very heavy paper pages, and wire spiral binding mean this book should go outside, and not sit on the shelf at home. At a reasonable price of five bucks, you can afford to wear one out every few years. One suggestion I have is stapling the quick reference cards for your HT and mobile rig inside the back cover so they are always at hand.
