THE MONTHLY MEETING OF G.C.A.F.C. WILL BE HELD WIM. MAY FIRST AT THE CUANS-ILLINOIS CLUBHOUSE. MEETING STAITS AT 8 P.M. LOGIAM WILL DE A RITY I EMONSTRATION BY W2JAV.

The time is rapidly approaching that event of the year known as National Amateur Radio Week and the traditional Field Day. This is for many hams throught out The U.S. and Canada a very enjoyable occasion and a challenge to surpass their previous field day performances. If there are any hams among us who have never experienced or do not know what field day is all about, you owe it to yourself to get into the activity this year. It will start Saturday June 22nd at 1600 hours and last until Sunday the 23rd at1600 hours. Further details and rules will be in the June issue of QST. Any member of the field day committee will be glad to answer any questions you may have about this event. The committee will welcome all club members who wish to participate in the club's field day activities. Plans at present are for concentrated efforts on 80, 40 and 20 meters for CW and SSB. These are the bands that the highest scores are made in previous years of experience. No plans have been made for 10. 6 and 2 meters, 10 meters is poor at this time for very many points. For 6 and 2 nobody has shown any interest up till now and unless a sufficient number of hams are interested and provide gear. these bands will not be operated this year. In the past 6 and 2 were set up for the benefit of novices and technicians who can not operate on the lower bands. However, novices and technicians may assist on the lower bands as loggers if the VHF bands are not operated.

In previous years there has been a shortage of operators who are willing to to camp out during the night hours from about 2200 to 0800 the next morning. This creates a handicap because there should always be two operators maning each station at all times. One for operatings and one to check off stations worked to avoid working the same station more than once on each band. To properly maintain an adequate operation at might we should have at least four operators per station during the wee hours. If only the low free, bands are operated with three stations we will need 12 night owl type operators and at least 12 more for the normal people's hours.

Each person or group will make their own arrangements for meals. Usually this is done with camping type stoves or charcoal burners. No hot plates please, we need the electric power for the lights and radio gear. Nost night time operators was sleeping bags or cots for sleeping. So far shelter is provided for the three stations. Any additional tents for sleeping or for 6 and 2 meters do not appear to be available at this time. However, this situation may change Before the field day is held.
