

### FIELD DAY '95







### MEET YOUR FELLOW CLUB MEMBER

Editor's Note:

As promised, we are continuing our feature, "Meet Your Fellow Club Member," with an interview this month of one of our newer Club members, Kyle Cassidy, KB2RVY. The editors also want to mention that in addition to providing the substance of an interview, Kyle has graciously offered to assume a major role in the production and layout of Crosstalk. We are very grateful for his assistance and hope that all of us working together can continue to bring our membership a high-quality product every month!

Kyle Cassidy has a lot of purple hair (much to the chagrin of his mother) and is therefore relatively easy to spot if you happen to be around the Rowan College campus, where he is both a senior majoring in English Literature and an employee of the college's Academic Computing department. If anyone has any questions about Internet or other related computer subjects, his name often comes up. offered workshops on the use of Internet and has contributed articles to the college's publications. Kyle indeed is a talented writer, a skill that did not go unnoticed among fellow students and the faculty. "The Academic Computing Department asked me to write a textbook on the use of Internet," Kyle explained." At that time, Internet was not all that well known and instruction manuals few and far between. Currently his first Internet textbook "SATURN: A Beginners Guide to Using the Internet" is being used at over 100 colleges, universities and corporations around the world.

The marriage of an English major to the world of computer sci-

ence came through a novel that Kyle was writing in his early undergraduate years at Rowan College (then Glassboro State College). "It was a lamentable novel—but I learned how to use the word processor really well." which led, he explained, to helping others out. You can fill in the blanks -- success builds upon itself, and soon Kyle became an important campus resource -- a writer cum computer guru!

For Kyle, explaining technical topics is both a talent and a love. In the current issue of "Access," the newsletter for Rowan College's Academic Computing Department, Kyle writes about such diverse topics as TCP/IP (readers will recall his excellent article on this topic in the last issue of Crosstalk) and finding a suitable carrying case for a laptop computer (yes, one actually can make a fashion statement by choosing a certain kind of case for a laptop).

Kyle's interest in amateur radio parallels his interest in computing, the Internet, and technical things in general. He believes that Internet opens up a new, complimentary universe with amateur radio. Using "Internet Relay Chat" (IRC), Kyle can talk with amateurs all over the world on the Internet. "It's sort of like radio, but it's not," he says. "The Internet is really heavily populated by nerds like me and consequently, there are are a lot of other hams out there. There's always some one to talk to on the Internet."

When asked about non-Internet ham operating, Kyle, who holds a general class license, remarked, "Well, I've yet to make my first Morse Code contact, but I would like to. 2 meter CW on Field Day maybe?" He added, "I love this hobby and want to learn more about the technical side." As for the Club, Kyle believes he can make a contribution by writing for Crosstalk and by helping to develop other reference materials. "I like to write things down," he said, "it's one of only a handful of things that I'm actually good at so it's a shame not to exploit it. I'd like to develop instructional materials to help hams enjoy the hobby more."

When not writing about the Internet and computer-related subjects, Kyle spends his time with his wife Linda, N3TPK, who is a junior at the Moore College of Art in Philadelphia. "The lamentable novel," he adds with a grin, "that's still around too."
