DX REPORT

9M6 - Bruce, KD6WW will be active from 9M6AAC at Hillview Gardens (Sabah, East Malaysia). Before and after the contest he will try to make sunrise and sunset on 160 metres, while other activity will be primarily WARC and RTTY. Bruce will be vacationing in that area and therefore he will not be on every day. QSL via N2OO.

A4 - Mary, G0BQV will be active (on all bands CW) as A4/G0BQV from Oman between 21 October and 1 November. QSL via G0BQV.

C5 - The Bavarian Contest Club operators (DF4RD, DL5NAM, DL8UD, DL9NDS, OE2VEL, OE2MON) [425DXN 383] have been issued C56A to be used before and after the CQ WW SSB DX Contest, while during the contest they will be active as C56T. QSL via DL5NAM.

E3 - The Space A DX Group are finalizing their plans for the Dxpediton to Eritrea. The operators (EA8AFJ, I8NHJ, IV3FSG, JH1AJT, K3VN, K5VT, K8RF, KO4RR, N2WB, N5VL, N9NS, NF6S, OK1TN, S53R, W4WX and WD4NGB, plus a few guest operators) will be arriving in Asmara in two groups, one on the night of 3 November and the main group on the night of 4 November, and they will make every attempt to be active starting during 5 November. They will be operating four stations, 24 hours a day, on 10-160 metres CW, SSB and RTTY. Individual callsigns will be issued upon arrival starting at E30AA and up. It is hoped the operators will be allowed to use only one call per site; however they may be using their own call for the last few hours (they expect to go QRT on 17 November). They plan to participate in the CQ WW SSB DX Contest as DK8YY/HI8, while before and after the contest they will concentrate on CW. W - W98ITU, special event station of the international Telecommunications Union's Plenipotentiary Conference being held in Minneapolis will be QRV on RTTY, CW and SSB modes until 23.59 UTC on 7 November. SEDSAT-1 SATELLITE TO LAUNCH OCTOBER 25!

The SEDSAT-1 satellite package is set go into space Sunday, October 25, at 1200 UTC. That word this week from Chris Bond, KF4UGG, at the University of Alabama-Huntsville. SEDSAT-1 will include Amateur Radio digital packet store-and-forward and analog repeater systems. SEDSAT-1 will fly as a secondary passenger along with the Jet Propulsion Laboratory's Deep Space One mission aboard a Delta II booster.

Built by students at the University of Alabama's Huntsville campus, SEDSAT-1 will carry a Mode L digital transponder as well as a Mode A analog transponder.

Project coordinator and UAH Associate Professor Mark Maier, KF4YGR, says SEDSAT will separate from the second stage over the Eastern Pacific between California and Hawaii about 83 minutes after launch. SEDSAT will begin transmitting Mode L.

The Mode L frequencies will be 1268.175 to 1268.250 MHz up and 437.850 to 438.000 MHz down, FSK, 9600 baud. The Mode A frequencies will be 145.915 to 145.975 MHz up, and 29.35 to 29.42 MHz down.

Maier says the Mode A transponder will not be turned on immediately. "It will take several weeks and will have to be scheduled because of power issues," he said. "Also, we've seen a bit of frequency drift with time and temperature so don't be surprised at some changes in the exact values on orbit." Maier says this is due to the fact that the radios are "several years old, from an earlier incarnation of the project."

TNC and I would certainly put together a RTTY interface to run on the club station. There is also the concept of slow-scan TV that could be pursued. Any father's out there that think their youngsters would get a thrill in seeing Mickey Mouse or Scooby-Doo coming across the ham radio? Mine did, years ago. Great selling point for the YF, also. Granted these are modes that really take it tough on a rig and amplifier, so we adjust accordingly. We also have the the RTTY world wide contest coming up in January. We could participate as a club.

I participate in this club because I enjoy it and have known a lot of great people. That's why I joined. If this club is to continue then we need more people that feel the same way. You as a member are one of two things, part of the problem or part of the solution. If you complain, shirk your responsibilities, or just don't show up, then I'd say you're part of the problem. If you are active and want to volunteer for things, then you are part of the solution. Stay with it. This club will do one of two things in the not too distant future, it will either pick back up and start being active again or it will wither away. You, as a member, have a direct influence on the outcome.

I make no apology for a very long editorial as the Board of Directors, such as we had at the last meeting, knew this was coming. I believe very strongly in this club as I have great memories and friends from it over the years and would love nothing more than to see it come back to what it once was.
