DX Dope

Boy, hard to get back to normal business after lollygagging for several hours at the Hamfest last Sunday. What a simply outstanding day especially weather-wise! Cool breeze, sunshine, great sausage sandwiches, the company of fellow Hams and a nice cigar (thanks to W2YC). Hope everyone found the stuff they were looking for. I found about half of what I wanted.

Would like to describe an incident which has some lessons for the new ham/DXer. Adjacent to my driveway along the street is an Atlantic Electric Co. pole which supports only a street light (underground wiring throughout the area) and the bulb is one of the newer sodium lamps. This bulb chugs along fine for about 2 years, then it starts to fluctuate between dim and normal at approximately 3 minute intervals. When it is dim, the accompanying rapid cackle noise on the lower ham bands (160 through 30) is horrendous. On 80 meters it wipes out all but the strongest signals. Fortunately, a call to the Electric Company Customer Service number brings very fast relief. In fact, the repairman arrived in his bucket truck two days later and replaced the bulb which immediately brought peace and quiet back to 80 meters. Oh, by the way, it helps to give them the pole number which is stamped into a metal strip and attached to the pole about eye level. The pole number is normally about five or six digits in length. For some 20 years, I have had good success with the Electric Company promptly changing the bulb. You simply tell them that the old bulb is causing RFI to your radios, appliances, TV, etc. and to please change it. However, a new wrinkle developed during the most recent campaign. I was cutting my grass (rotary mower) and, when cutting around the subject pole, I cannot help bumping the pole slightly with the mower. Seconds after the first bump, I heard a loud crash above the noise of the mower! Investigation revealed that the slight bump had caused the globe and aluminum globe support (the globe surrounds the bulb) to fall with the glass globe smashing into a hundred pieces! Fortunately, the missiles missed my pate by about 2 feet. A second call to said Electric Company brought the technician in record time and the necessary repairs this time proved successful as subsequent bumps with the mower have failed to dislodge said support.
