CLUB MOBILE RADIO UNITS AIDED IN PARADE AND WATER CARNIVAL

Several of the GCARC members were busy on Aug. 18th creating good public relations in the county for us hams. At 11:00 AM Clayton had a parade celebrating their 75th anniversary. Mobile units on 6 meters were Ed WA2ELW (in W2MED's Car), Della W2AFZ, Bob WA2MWF and Woody K2AQL. The Parade chairman rode along with WA2ELW at the head of the parade. All cars were equipped with posters of our club emblem.

At 2030 the same day at Lake Garrison W2RJQ Van, W2MED Mal, WA2MWF Bob, WA2FMC Eric and Tad W2CKX (with operators W2AFZ and K2AQL assisting) provided communications for their 25th annual water carnival. This was a pageant of floats mounted on canoes or boats. As the floats were rowed by each of five stations a recording for the theme of that float was played over a P.A. system. Everything was kept coordinated by the above listed hams on a six meter network of five six meter rigs.

Confirmations for DXCC credit for either Guam or the Marianas must be dated November 15, 1945 or after. Committees

Program- This months program will feature an interesting talk, demonstration, etc. on silk screen photography, the speaker, our own Milt Goldman, WA2ECR, a most capable authority on the subject.

Awards- The 4 homebrew contest winners will receive their readied certificates at this months meeting. K3GYS will be notified that his submitted list of 11 GCARC contacts will have to be updated if he is to receive an award.

TVI- K2PQD informs us that WA2ECR's xmtr is clean as his own TV set (20 ft. from the xmtr) gives no indication of TVI. The neighbor has to go!

CD- W2KE would like assistance in converting some sound powered army field phones to battery operation.

Code Class- A meeting will be shortly held to set-up this years classes. We will purchase two code oscillators and keys.

Ham Fest- W2YNR and committee received plaudits for a job well done. All final reports are trickling in and will be reported at the next club meeting. Milts report was read. We have apparently come-out in the Black to the tune of \$20. Numerous bills are still outstanding.

Publicity- W2YNR will put notices of the coming club meeting in the local papers. It was decided to contact Cliff Brown, WA2KGD in order to learn how to address a letter of thanks and certificate to the RC club for the wonderful job done at the Ham Fest.

Crosstalk- Eric Wolfbrandt, WA2NZY, will publish the paper until the end of the year.

Old Business

Tad mentioned that the Lake Garrison group really appreciated the 5 Hams from the club who assisted in the water carnival. Also our aid in the Clayton parade was likewise appreciated. The Club signs (car ads) were definitely readable, we were assured.
