Hamfest offers ham radio enthusiasts chance to tune in

HARRISON TWP. — From around the state and beyond they came, badges emblazoned with alphanumeric codes on their shirts: Jim, N2IMH; Chuck, N2HRA; Ernie and Bert, KB2AB and KG2G, respectively.

They are ham radio enthusiasts, come to the 4-H Fairgrounds in Mullica Hill for the Gloucester County Amateur Radio Club's 13th annual Hamfest Sunday.

The numbers are the radio buffs' all-important call signs, which allow them to reach out and touch, by Morse code, voice, television or teletype, other enthusiasts around the world.

The greatest part of the Hamfest is a large flea market, where all things radiologic are bought, sold and bartered. A visitor to the Hamfest might be able to buy a table-top microphone or sort through a large selection of vacuum tubes, all the while keeping in mind the mint-condition power meter at a table across the field.

Herb Schuler, president of the club in 1977, said at least 300 dealers had tables set up Sunday.

"We'll probably have 1,000 people through here to buy or to look today," he said.

Heavily represented among the regular radio equipment was a large amount of computer paraphernalia.

"Computers didn't come (onto the ham radio scene) until about five years ago. Now half the

people here are selling both kinds of equipment," Schuler said.

He said the computers are used in conjunction with the radios to act as Morse-code translators, teletype terminals, or equipment monitors. He said they are also useful to keep records on the worldwide radio contacts with other operators that many hams collect.

Postcards commemorating some of these international contacts, from as close as Puerto Rico and as far as the Soviet Union, were on display in the trailer that the club maintained on the fairgrounds.

The proceeds from the fair will go toward a \$500 scholarship for one Gloucester County high school student.

Schuler said the club hopes to give it to someone who will be studying electronics or engineering at the college level, though last year's winner is studying electronics at Lincoln Tech, a private trade school. This is only the second year of the scholarship.

The other main business of the club was to recruit and test new members.

The club, which celebrated its 30th anniversary in April, will probably have more than 200 members by year's end, Schuler said.

Jim Castro, a volunteer tester for the club, said the Federal Communications Commission allows ham radio organizations to do their own testing for FCC broadcast licenses.

He said he had tested about 30 people from 8 a.m. to noon, and Schuler estimated that about 70 percent

of those passed.

Deborah Aldukas of Brick Township said she was "thrilled" to have gotten a perfect score on her Novice examination, which she had been studying for since January.

"For anybody taking the test for the first time, it's pretty exciting," said her husband, Chuck, who holds a General level FCC license.

The test for the Novice license, the first of five levels a ham radio operator can attain, consists of a five word per-minute Morse decryption test, a ten-question written test and a test on radio theory.

The ranks of amateur radio licenses are Novice, Technician, General, Advanced and Extra. Each level gives the operator greater privileges to utilize particular frequencies, to broadcast at higher power, and to transmit words and pictures, not just Morse code.

Club member Ernie Gigliobianco said one of the club's strengths is that it is open to people of all ages and types.

"We're the one group that has everybody from kids to old people as members," he said.

Greg Sternberg, a 17-year-old from Radnor, Pa., was one of the people to pass the Novice test Sunday.

"I had a little problem with the (Morse code) spacing, but I was able to get the answers out of the test anyway," Sternberg said.

But Gigliobianco said Sternberg is by no means the youngest person ever to obtain a ham license.

"We had a 7-year-old boy a couple of years ago get his license," he said.

A DISCUSSION FOLLOWED REGARDING TRANSMISSION OF CODE PRACTICE BY THE CLUB AND AN APPEAL WAS MADE FOR A CODE PUNCHING MACHINE.

MEETING ADJOURNED AT 1953 AND MOVIES WERE SHOWN COVERING SOME OF OUR FIELD DAY ACTIVITIES BY W2HSE.

ANNOUNCEMENT WAS MADE THAT THE CLUB WOULD HOLD ITS FIRST CHRISTMAS PARTY ON SATURDAY NIGHT, DECEMBER 12th. CLUB MEMBERS WILL HAVE THE PRIVILEGE OF BRINGING THEIR WIVES OR GIRL FRIENDS AS GUESTS.

JACK LAYTON REPORTED CONCERNING "CROSS-TALK" AND AFTER APPEALING FOR HELP IN ITS PUBLICATION HAD TWO VOLUNTEERS FOR SAME.

AFTER A DISCUSSION ON NEEDED ITEMS FOR THE CLUB PAPER THEY WERE APPROVED FOR PURCHASE. ABE WINTERS VOLUNTEERED TO PROVIDE ADDRESSED SLIPS FOR MAILING FOR A PERIOD OF ONE YEAR.

QUESTION OF INCORPORATION WAS RAISED AND WAS DEFERRED PENDING THE COMPLETION OF MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION FORMS.

GEORGE STUART RAISED THE QUESTION AS THE ADVISABILITY OF CLUB PARTICIPATION IN PENDING CONTESTS AND WAS APPOINTED A COMMITTEE OF ONE TO INVESTIGATE INTEREST.

MEETING ADJOURNED AT 2012 EST.

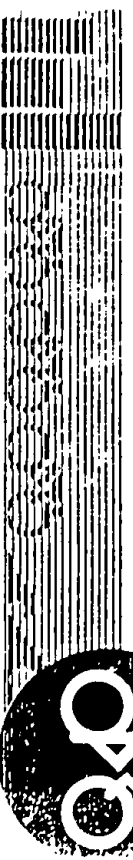

AN ACT concerning interception of police messages, supplementing Title 2C of the New Jersey Statutes and repealing P.L. 1977, c. 426.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. Any person who intercepts any message or transmission made on or over any police communications system, and uses the information obtained thereby to aid, abet or assist in committing a crime, or in violating any law of this State, or uses the same in a manner which interferes with the discharge of police operations, shall be guilty of a crime of the fourth degree.

2. P.L. 1977, c. 426 (C. 2A:127-4) is repealed.

3. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill provides that any person who intercepts any message or transmission made on or over a police communications system and uses that information to assist in committing a crime or in violating any law in New Jersey or uses the information in a manner which interferes with the discharge of police operations, is guilty of a crime of the fourth degree.

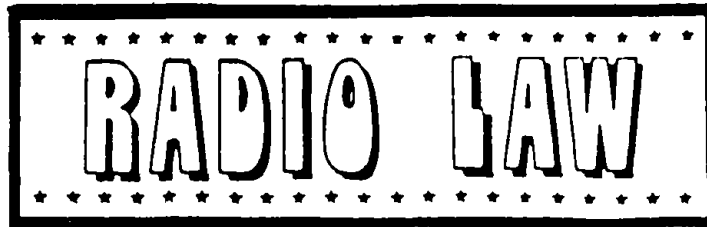
The bill also repeals P.L. 1977 c. 426. This existing law makes it a misdemeanor to have in an automobile a radio receiver operating on frequencies assigned for fire, police, municipal or other governmental uses, with certain exceptions provided.

Bill to Repeal New Jersey Ban on Mobile Receivers

ANARC's counsel, Frank Terranella, has succeeded in getting a bill introduced in the New Jersey State Legislature that would replace one of the nation's worst receiver laws with one which protects police communications without infringing on the rights of receiver owners.

New Jersey's current law, passed in 1977, makes it a crime for anyone except a government employee, volunteer fireman or rescue worker to have "in any automobile, a short-wave radio receiver operative on frequencies assigned by the [FCC] for...governmental uses" - unless one has a permit from the local police chief (NJSA 2A:127-4). In other words, simply carrying a general coverage shortwave receiver or scanner in your car is a misdemeanor in the state of New Jersey!

On May 8th, State Senate Majority Leader John Lynch introduced NJ S 3593. An identical bill is supposed to be introduced by Assemblyman William Schuber when the State Assembly reconvenes on May 15th. Here is the full text of the new legislation:

"1. Any person who intercepts any message or transmission made on or over any police communications system, and uses the information obtained thereby to aid, abet or assist in committing a crime, or in violating any law of this State, or uses the same in a manner which interferes with the discharge of police operations, shall be guilty of a crime of the fourth degree.

"2. P.L. 1977, c. 426 (C. 2A:127-4) is repealed.

"3. This act shall take effect immediately."

If passed, this bill would not limit the possession or use of receivers; it would outlaw only the misuse of monitored information. "All members of the radio community who vote in New Jersey should contact their local legislator to be sure that he/she supports these bills," says Frank.
