Hams Reach Out To The World...And Beyond

NEWINGTON, Conn., Aug. 4, 1992 -

When Space Shuttle Columbia Commander Dick Richards asked if any Amateur Radio operators wanted to talk to him, Californians Dan and Adrienne Sherwood answered his call. So did Randy Shriver of Hanover, Penn.

Dan, Adrienne and Randy are three of more than 540,000 Americans who enjoy ham radio. Today, Amateur Radio is more popular than ever, according to Steve Mansfield, spokesperson for the American Radio Relay League (ARRL).

More than 100,000 people have become Amateur Radio operators since 1989.", Mansfield says. "The new code-free Technician Class license offered by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has sparked much of that growth. In addition, worldwide attention from events such as the Shuttle Amateur Radio EXperiment (SAREX), which features astronauts talking to students via Amateur Radio, has helped raise awareness."

Amateur Radio Awareness Day (September 19) was created by the ARRL to draw national attention to ham radio. During the event, hams throughout the country will sponsor displays at local malls and shopping centers, and coordinate open houses with community groups to introduce this fast-growing pastime to others.

People are attracted to Amateur Radio for many reasons, but none is more poignant than the humanitarian efforts of Connecticut ham NedRaub.

Raub used Amateur Radio communications to help free a Cambodian, Piseth "Seth" Keo, from a refugee camp along the

Thai-Cambodian border and reunite Keo with his family in the U.S. His most recent efforts have helped a Russian cancer patient named Natalya receive the drugs for chemotherapy treatment.

OSLs to C.I.S.

In the may issue of Crosstalk, K2JF\John gave a list of C.I.S. station bureaus for QSL to bypass Box88, Moscow (which I believe is not working now). Another way is to use one of the private Russian Bureaus. For almost 3 years now, I have used Uaghsn for delivery of hundreds of cards. Sometimes I have received a card back through him in just 3-4 months. I have worked over 100 CW oblasts this way in 2 1/2 years.

Another way to get your Russian cards delivered is direct. Lately many C.I.S. stations are giving out their address. If you want to QSL direct, and don't have an address, Ican probably find it since Ihave a 1991 Russian callbook. My phone number is 589-0686.

Want to increase your chances of getting that Russian QSL for your oblast or award? One way is to send the ol' 'green stamp'. Another is to just ask for it in their language. (Editor's Note: I wish I had a system to type Cyrilic(Russian) characters, but I don't. N2FZ\Bill can show you how it is done! Sorry, Bill!) Anyway, Bill does this with all his Russian QSL cards, and sometimes he gets the cards back quickly.
