

Study Fails to Find EMF-Cancer Link

The Council of the American Physical Society (APS) has issued the results of a study entitled "Power Line Fields and Public Health," concerning the potential dangers of cancer from electromagnetic fields that emanate from common power lines and electrical appliances.

The APS concluded that "the scientific literature and the reports of reviews by other panels show no consistent, significant link between cancer and power line fields" and "the preponderance of ... research findings have failed to substantiate those studies which have reported specific adverse health effects from exposure to such fields.

"While it is impossible to prove that no deleterious health effects occur from exposure to any environmental factor," it is necessary to demonstrate a consistent, significant, and causal relationship before once can conclude that such effects do occur. From this standpoint, the conjectures relating cancer to power line fields have not been scientifically substantiated."

The APS said that billions of dollars are being spent by states and municipalities to mitigate and litigate this perceived problem and "the burden of cost placed on the American public is incommensurate with the risk, if any."

New Licensing Group Proposed

The following is from The W5YI REPORT, Volume 17, Issue # 15 August 1, 1995:

* Jim Wills, N5HCT, Tyler, TX. the amateur who got "Vanity" call signs enacted, has sent a very controversial letter to Newt Gingrich, Speaker of the House of Representatives. He suggests "A quasi-governmental, self-governing and self-funding tax-free organization could be created to handle all the duties of the FCC pertaining to amateur and commercial radio licensing with each VEC holding one seat and having one vote on the board. One member from the amateur radio community at large and one member from the commercial licensed operators at large could be appointed by the Telecommunications Sub-Committee for a

specified term, say six years, to sit on the board with full and equal voting authority as other board members. The Sub-committee would maintain oversight juristiction."

Wills recommends that the Amateur Service and commercial radio licensing be removed from the FCC and placed under the auspices of the National Volunteer Examination Coordinators along with all power of enforcement and responsibility to govern and control amateur radio activities and commercial radio licensing.

The new emerging organization would be called the National Radio Licensing Authority (NRLA) and would be supported by fee collection for services rendered. Wills asks that "...all pertinent assets including hardware and software, rules and historical files be transferred to the NRLA. ...All NRLA rulings would carry the full authority of the U.S. Government. All enforcement problems that NRLA could not handle would be turned over to the Justice Department for implementation. ...By taking this action, the FCC could devote its full time efforts and resources to whatever it does."

Power and Range -Did You Know?

At VHF, a one-watt radio talks approximately one mile on flat terrain. Doubling the power increases your range by only 33 percent, but doubling your antenna height increases your range by 50 percent!

The 1-10-100 Rule: One watt will talk ten miles to a hundred foot antenna. Hills, buildings or any other obstructions can reduce

range by 20 percent to 66 percent.

WHO WROTE THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE?

Ask most people who wrote the Star Spangled Banner, and they'll tell you Francis Scott Key. Ask them who wrote the Declaration of Independence, and many will say Thomas Jefferson. But ask them who wrote the Pledge of Allegiance and most won't know. It's not surprising. Until 1939, not even historians were sure of the

real author. The Pledge first appeared in the September 8, 1892, edition of The Youth's Companion as part of the official program for school children throughout the nation to commemorate the 400th anniversary of the discovery of America. The Pledge was first recited at the dedication of the World's Columbian Exposition Grounds at Chicago in October 1892. Two members of the staff of The Youth's Companion were Mr. Francis Bellamy and Mr. James Upham. For 47 years the family of each man claimed authorship for him and held evidence to substantiate their claims. Finally on 1939, a committee was appointed to weigh carefully the conflicting evidence. Unanimously, they decided in favor of Francis Bellamy. Unfortunately, Francis Bellamy, an ordained Baptist minister, had died eight years previously. Congress officially designated his work as the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag on December 28, 1945.

The Pledge of Allegiance, as originally written differs slightly from its present form. In 1923, the phrase, "of the United States of America" was added following "the flag." On Flag Day, 1954, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed into Law, House Resolution 243 which inserted the meaningful words, "under God," after "one nation."

Mid-Atlantic Amateur Radio Club Sponsors ILL Ukrainian Ham

It was May of 1992 when Mike Pilotti and Nick Bortnik first met on the amateur radio bands. "CQ North America, CQ North America." This is UX0OZZ in Nikolaev, Ukraine calling and listening." "UX0OZZ, this is N3IRZ in Phoenixville, PA. How do you copy?" replied Mike Pilotti, a member of the Mid-Atlantic ARC. With that exchange, a unique friendship was born, 5000 miles from each other. During the next several months, Mike and Nick repeatedly and unexpectedly ran into each other while conversing with other ham radio operators.

"It was uncanny, even though there is an eight hour time difference between us, we kept bumping into each other," says Pilotti. "Short-wave radio contacts to far away countries are often professional and businesslike. You exchange information about your radio equipment, the weather, and a signal report and move on to the next contact. Something clicked between Nick and me," continued Pilotti. "We found we have a lot in common. When short-wave conditions permit, we talk for hours." Nick can be heard on 20 meters working the world. Pilotti is now Nick's QSL manager.


Nick, who is 31 years old, is married and the father of a one-year old baby boy, stricken in late 1994 with a strange illness. "You have to remember, the Ukraine lacks medical technology; their hospitals are equivalent to what we had in the U.S. in the 1930s and CAT SCANS and MRIs are non-existent," said Pilotti.

Nick's health continued to decline rapidly. He spoke with Mike weekly and explained that he feared for his life. "It began to gnaw at me: I wanted to help him, but I didn't know what I could do," Pilotti said. He explained to Nick that although he could raise funds for his airfare to and from the U.S., it would be difficult to find a U.S. hospital willing to donate testing and treatment services. However, within a few days, medical and hospitalization assistance were obtained.

Nick is currently obtaining his VISA from the U.S. Embassy in Kiev and Congressman Jon Fox's office is helping to expedite it quickly. Pilotti is trying to raise funds for Nick's airfare. The Mid-Atlantic ARC has agreed to sponsor the trip and has raised and donated half the money required.

Pilotti hopes to raise enough money to bring Nick to the area. While Nick's health is the primary concern, he also would like to bring his wife and child over to keep him company during his hospital stay.
