AMATEUR MICROSATS TO BE LAUNCHED! (from W5YI Report)

A consortium of Amateur Radio groups have teamed up with the Center for Aerospace Technology (CAST) at Weber State College (Utah) to construct and launch a new class of sophisticated "mission specific" ultra-compact "microsatellites."

Three AMSAT organizations (AMSAT-NA/North America, AMSAT-LU/Argentina, and Brazil's BRAMSAT) will be aided by TAPR, Tucson Amateur Packet Radio and the ARRL in the endeavor.

The four satellites, now under construction in Boulder, Colorado, are only 2 inches square and weigh only 22 pounds each. The two AMSAT-NA and AMSAT-LU payloads are PACSATS - store and forward packet radio communications satellites that can blanket the earth up to eight times a day. According to Brazil AMSAT president, Dr. Junior DeCastro, PY2BJO, BRAMSAT's Project DOVE (Digital Orbiting Voice Encoder) aims to "Be the first satellite specifically designed to transmit

voice synthesized messages that implicitly promote peace among nations." DOVE will "speak" to anyone who has a simple VHF scanner/radio. "It will not become a propaganda machine for anyone," DeCastro said. The CAST satellite is an earth-looking, low resolution camera. AMSAT-NA has already contracted to launch the four microsats aboard the V-34 Arianspace mission scheduled for June 1989.



Again, let me extend my thanks to you - a well done job by all. I appreciate it and I know the club is in your debt.





Novice/Technician Award

For Novices and Technicians only: Work any 25 GCARC members on the 10 meter band (28.100 to 28.500 MHz), using any authorized mode. QSL verification required.

Extra Award

Work any 30 GCARC Amateur Extra Class members, any mode, on any band below 54 $\mathcal{MH}z$.

QSL verification required.

RTTY Award

Work any 15 GCARC members on RTTY on any band below 54 MIlz. QSL verification required.

Mixed Award

Work any 50 GCARC members, any mode, on any band below 54 MIlz. QSL verification required.

CW Award

Work any 25 GCARC members on CW (point to point) on any band below 54 MIlz. QSL verification required.

Only contacts made on or after January 1, 1988 are valid for all GEARE

12 Meter DX Award

Work any 25 countries, any mode, on 12 meters to start award; then 15 more for the next sticker; then 10 more to 50 for the next sticker; then 5 more for each additional sticker thereafter. QSL verification required.

12 Meter W.A.S. Award

Work any 25 states, any mode, on 12 meters to start award; then 10 more for the next sticker; then 5 more for another sticker; then 1 each until 50 states have been worked. QSL verification required.

VHF/UHF AWARDS

MIXED AWARD

WORK ANY 50 GCARC MEMBERS ON ANY BAND ABOVE 50 MHz., USING EI-THER SSB, CW, PACKET OR RITY.

QSL VERIFICATION REQUIRED.

RTTY AWARD

WORK ANY 15 GCARC MEMBERS ON ANY BAND ABOVE 50 MHz. SUGGEST-ED FREQUENCY IS 145.25 MHz.

QSL VERIFICATION RE-QUIRED.

SSB AWARD

WORK ANY 25 GCARC MEMBERS ON SSB ON ANY BAND ABOVE 50 MHz.

PACKET AWARD

WORK ANY 15 GCARC MEMBERS ON ANY BAND ABOVE 50 MHz. SUGGEST-ED FREQUENCY IS 147.54 MHz.

QSL VERIFICATION REQUIRED.

BAND ABOVE 50 MHz.

QSL VERIFICATION RE-

QUIRED.

UHF AWARD

WORK ANY 10 GCARC MEMBERS (POINT TO POINT) ON ANY BAND ABOVE 450 MHz., USING ANY MODE.

QSL VERIFICATION REQUIRED.

YL/XYL AWARD

For YL's/XYL's ONLY --

Work any 15 GCARC members plus any 3 YL's/XYL's, any mode, on any band below 54 MHz.

QSL verification required.

<u>DARC</u>: Deutsches Amateur Radio Club, national radio club of Germany, like our ARRL.

GMT, UTC, or Z: Greenwich Mean Time, Universal Coordinated Time (the acronym UTC comes from the French for the phrase) or Zulu. This means solar time of the meridian at Greenwich, England, used as the basis for standard time throughout the world. In QSLing this is the only standard to use. There is a chart in front of every issue of the Radio Amateur Callbook telling you how to figure GMT out.

(Here in New Jersey when EDT is in use ADD 4 hours. Example: when it is 0800 EDT here, it is 1200 NOON Z. When we go back on EST ADD 5 hours so 0800 here will be 1300 Z).

REENSTAMP: Slang for an American dollar bill, commonly used for return postage for the DX station for whom you have QSL's. One has to be careful, not all countries will accept an American dollar bill, e.g. USSR and its satellites, Pakistan, Bangladesh, etc. Check with an experienced DXer if you are not sure.

IOTA: Islands On The Air. An award for working various islands throughout the world. Directories and rules are available from G3KMA for \$3.00 U.S. or 7 IRCs.

IRC: International Reply Coupon, is bought at the post office and can be exchanged in other countries for the proper postage. They are expensive now, about 90 cents, and most DXers send a greenstamp. They can be sought from QSL managers, ally around 50 cents, but do not use IRC's that are over 2

years old. The number of IRCs for the various countries may be found in the *Radio Amateur Call-book*.

SAE: Self Addressed Envelope. When QSLing to a foreign station or foreign QSL manager you included this along with your QSL card and a "Greenstamp."

SASE: Self Addressed Stamped Envelope. When QSLing a QSL manager of a station in your country, these are included with your QSL card to help the person defray the postage cost and time of addressing the return QSL.

WFWL: Work First Worry Later. Refers to a station that may be a priate or not valid for DXCC, but one is not sure and works it just incase it is valid.


For you starting DXers hope this helps.
